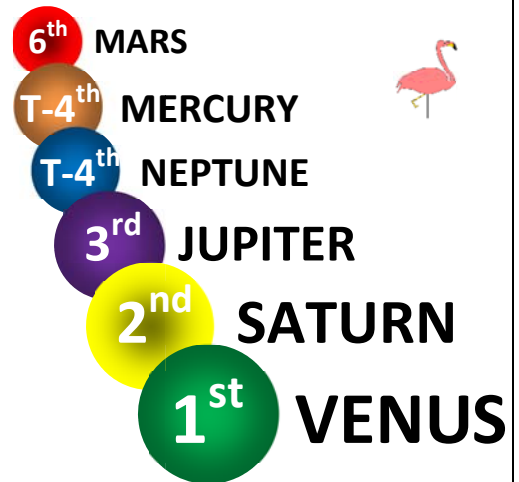

Color War 2010
